## YOU CAN HELP EVERY DAY

Clean Straddie is a collaborative campaign to reduce litter and marine debris through clean-ups, source reduction activities and educational campaigns for the North Stradbroke/Minjerribah Island community.

Volunteers collected and reported more than **73,000** litter items on North Stradbroke Island from **MARCH 2012 TO JUNE 2015**. The items here are regularly reported through the Tangaroa Blue Foundation's Australian Marine Debris Initiative database. You can help take action.

### CHOOSE REUSABLES

**30%** of items found on Straddie are plastic, including many disposable items that we could avoid.



### TAKE YOUR HOOK, LINE AND SINKER

More than **50 KM** of fishing line has been collected at Amity Point (that's **LONGER THAN** Straddie!)



### SIP WITHOUT A STRAW



Easy way to avoid plastic you will use for **10 MINUTES!**

### PICK UP BEACH LITTER!

An estimated **88%** of litter from clean-ups appears to be from island-based sources.



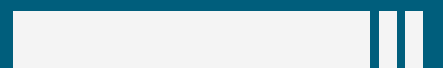
### JUST SAY NO TO POLYSTYRENE

Polystyrene is the **4TH** most common litter item from clean-ups.



### BIN YOUR BUTTS

Cigarette butts account for **1 OUT OF 4** litter items
